**INVENERGY THERMAL DEVELOPMENT LLC's RESPONSES TO
CONSERVATION LAW FOUNDATION'S EIGHTH SET OF DATA REQUESTS**

Request 8-1 As of June 1, 2017, is Invenergy's second turbine qualified by the Independent System Operator-New England (ISO-NE) to participate in Forward Capacity Auction-12 (FCA-12), scheduled to be conducted in February 2018?

RESPONSE 8-1 The ISO-NE is scheduled to notify New Capacity Resources of their Qualification Determination for FCA-12 on September 29th. The ISO notifies all resources of their MWs that are qualified to participate on October 23, and it will make their FERC filings for FCA-12 on November 7. Unit 2 qualified for the previous 2 Capacity Commitment Periods (CCPs) prior to CCP 12, and is currently going through the ISO NE process to participate in FCA 12. Invenergy Thermal Development LLC (Invenergy) has no reason to believe unit 2 will be disqualified for FCA-12.

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Question 8-2 pertains to Invenergy's Capacity Supply Obligation (CSO) obtained from ISO-NE in FCA-10 for 485 MW, which CSO was originally scheduled to commence on June 1, 2019, the first day of ISO-NE's Capacity Commitment Period-10.

Request 8-2(a) Is Invenergy's 485-MW CSO, obtained in FCA-10, now scheduled to commence on June 1, 2020?

RESPONSE 8-2(a) No, the CSO is scheduled to start on June 1, 2019. If your question is referring to the start of commercial operations the exact commercial in service date for Clear River will depend on many factors and it is in Invenergy's best interest to bring the project online as quickly as possible, and Invenergy is currently estimating that the Project could achieve operations by June 1, 2020. If Invenergy cannot place Clear River in service on time, Invenergy is subject to any and all expenses associated with the delay.
